Sri Chakra Navavarana Sri Vidya Puja - For Spiritual Power And Protection

The term "navavarana" refers to the nine enclosures or layers surrounding the central point of the Sri Chakra, which represents the divine feminine energy. Devotees meticulously follow specific steps including chanting mantras, performing yantra puja, offering flowers and incense, and meditating on each layer of the Sri Chakra. It's for those seeking spiritual transformation, healing, abundance, and ultimately union with higher consciousness.

Rudrabhishekam - For Removing Karmic Obstacles And Enhancing Life

Abhishekam means bathing ceremony and Rudra means Shiva. Rudrabhishekam is performed to Lord Shiva. When performed with utmost devotion, it creates positive energy and dispels or neutralizes negative energy within our mind or physical body.

Bhagavadgita Recitation (108 Times) - For Spiritual Wisdom And Enlightenment

The practice of Bhagavadgita recitation, especially when done 108 times, holds great significance in Hindu spirituality. The repetition of this sacred text is believed to, not only purify the mind and soul, but also establish a deep connection with the divine. Each recitation allows for a deeper understanding of the profound teachings imparted by Lord Krishna to Arjuna on the battlefield of Kurukshetra. Ganapati Sahasra Modaka Yagya - For Removing Obstacles And Gaining Success




Samoohika Bhagavadgita Yagya
